PRIX DU BOURBONNAIS – AMÉRIQUE RACES Q#2: JOSH POWER DOMINATES AND SECURES HIS QUALIFICATION



Eighteen trotters, aged between 5 and 10, competed in the **Prix du Bourbonnais - Amérique Races Q#2**, the longest qualifying race over a demanding 2850-metre course. After an unlucky performance in the **Prix de Bretagne - Amérique Races Q#1**, **Josh Power** made no mistakes this time, delivering a stellar performance. Alongside him, **Emeraude de Bais, Hokkaïdo Jiel, and** the surprising **Fakir de Mahey** also secured their places for the prestigious **Prix d'Amérique Legend Race**. The **Prix de France Speed Race** on February 9th and the **Prix de Paris Marathon Race** on February 23rd could also feature prominently in their upcoming schedules.

The race began with **Don Fanucci Zet** taking an impressive early lead before being overtaken on the descent by **Fakir de Mahey**. **Josh Power**, positioned strategically in third, advanced to challenge the leaders. As the climb began, **Emeraude de Bais**, driven by Pierre-Yves Verva, closely shadowed **Josh Power**.

Entering the final bend, *Fakir de Mahey* clung tenaciously to his lead, refusing to give in. However, just before the start of the final straight, *Josh Power* broke free from *Emeraude de Bais*, launching a decisive attack on the leading pair. With approximately 50 metres to the finish line, Eric Raffin guided *Josh Power* to victory, pulling ahead by a clear length with an impressive rate at 1'11"5/km.

Hokkaïdo Jiel, accelerating powerfully on the outside, stormed into second place, while Fakir de Mahey, displaying admirable determination, held on for fourth. This result was enough to secure his qualification for the Prix d'Amérique Legend Race, marking a well-deserved achievement.




Post-Race Reactions

Eric Raffin, visibly relieved, shared his thoughts with Equidia: "It's never easy stepping in for Sébastien Ernault. Last time, I didn't drive well, so qualifying the horse today was very important for me. The pressure was immense. When I saw Hohneck close on us in the last turn, I didn't hesitate to push him with blinkers, and he responded perfectly. Full credit to Sébastien's wife, who has brought him to the top, and a big thank you to his entire team."

Sébastien Ernault, the emotional coach, also commented on the team effort behind the victory: "As I'm off work at the moment, my wife and the team have been working tirelessly. Today, they were rewarded for all their hard work. I was a little anxious about the race, but everything unfolded in his favour. Josh Power has an exceptional mentality and never holds a grudge. We're still unsure if he'll race in the Ténor de Baune, but we'll see."





The Amérique Races will be back on the Vincennes track on Sunday 22nd December with not one but two races. The Critérium Continental - Amérique Races Q#3 reserved for the best 4-year-old trotters. The Prix Ténor de Baune - Amérique Races Q#4 will see top 5-year-old horses compete. Only the winners of these two Group I events will be entitled to take part in the Prix d'Amérique Légend Race.
