Prix de Paris Marathon Race: A Test of Endurance and Speed



The Prix de Paris Marathon Race, the thrilling conclusion of the Amérique Races competition, is set to electrify the Hippodrome Paris-Vincennes this Sunday, 23rd February. Renowned for its gruelling distance and elite field, this prestigious Group I race promises a spectacular display of endurance and speed.

Fourteen top contenders will battle it out over the marathon 4,150-meter course, the longest at Paris-Vincennes. The race, the third and final leg of the Amérique Races, culminates after eight emotionally charged qualifying events. Competitors will navigate two circuits of the Grande Piste, tackling the challenging climb twice. This ultimate test of both horse and driver will showcase tactical prowess and provide ample opportunity for spectators to witness their champions in action.

Hussard du Landret and Inmarosa meet again

Will the Prix de Paris Marathon Race 2025 offer a remake of the previous edition? Hussard du Landret and Inmarosa, first and second in 2024, will be back in the running. The defending champion made headlines by shattering the event record. Benoît Robin's protégé clocked 1'11"9, compared with 1'13"3 for the previous mark set by Diable de Vauvert in 2022. Hussard du Landret also confirmed his fine form by finishing fifth in the Prix d'Amérique Legend Race. Inmarosa was a magnificent second in the Prix de France Speed Race. This striking duo will be in the spotlight once again.

The return of Sébastien Ernault

Sébastien Ernault, Josh Power's trainer-driver, was off the track from November 3 to February 14 due to a fractured arm. Josh Power has not been seen since his excellent fourth place in the Prix d'Amérique *Legend Race*. The long distance will suit him perfectly, so he'll have plenty of supporters.

From Cornulier to Prix de Paris

Joumba de Guez won the mounted trotting World Championship in the Prix de Cornulier on January 19th. Equally gifted in harness racing, Jean-Michel Bazire's partner, trained by his son Nicolas, has what it takes to shine in a race that has often been a success for versatile champions.

Other hopefuls

Behind these four favourites, a number of contenders have what it takes to muddy the waters. Iroise de la Noé, Ampia Mede SM, It's A Dollarmaker, Idéal Ligneries, Fakir de Mahey and Justin Bold all feature in the majority of predictions.
